

Cost of living in Riga (Monthly expenses: meals,	The cost of accommodation depends on the level of offered amenities and the number of people living in a room, e.g.		
accommodation, etc.)	 basic amenities – around 300 - 350 euros/month; better living conditions – 400-500 euros/month; the cost of accommodation in a private flat – approx. 20-30 euros/m2. 		
	Meal expenses depend on individual needs, but on average, they are approx. 2.5 - 3 euros per lunch and approx. 10 euros per day.		
	Public transport: The cost of a monthly transport card for all types of transport, except for trains, for all days of the month, is 16 euros for students. Students can purchase a monthly pass that costs 15 euros only at Riga Satiksme service centres upon presentation of a valid ISIC card and proof of student status from the Academy. The most convenient way is to use a Code Pass, which international students		
	can purchase and download via a mobile application, or a Time Pass, which allows you to get to and from your destination within 90 minutes.		
	A 90-minute pass costs 1 euro and 50 cents, and a one-day pass costs 5 euros.		
	Information on pass types, prices, conditions of use, and purchasing, including interactive maps and schedules, is available on the Riga Satiksme website by scanning this QR code.

	Utilities and services: at around 100 euros
