<b>Study course annotation</b>	<p><b>Aim of the studycourse</b> is to expand students' understanding of the meaning and role of religions in different cultures, to provide insight into traditions of pilgrimage, as well as the possibilities of using the sacred cultural heritage in the field of tourism.</p> <p><b>Tasks of the study course:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to expand understanding religion as a phenomenon of spiritual culture, its specifics and place of religions in the historical process;</li> <li>• to familiarize the students with the pilgrimages tradition in different religious practices and its ways of expression in modern culture;</li> <li>• introduce students to religious tourism specific and products in the context of the modern tourism industry;</li> <li>• to develop students' competences of designing religious tourism routes and to stimulate their professional interest in the development of religious tourism in Latvia.</li> </ul>

1.	Introduction. Religious tourism: term and type of tourism
2.	Religious / sacred tourism: infrastructure forms and specific.
3.	Religious tourism resources.



4.	Ancient world religions. Concepts of sacred space. Ancient Greek and Roman religions. Public cults and mysteries. Sacred objects of ancient religions in the context of modern culture.
5.	Abrahamic religions. Judaism: origin, spread, basic principles, organization, modern trends. Jewish traditions, rituals and holidays. The Sacred Heritage of Judaism. Pilgrimages in Judaism.
6.	Christianity: From Early Community to Modern Denominations. Medieval Christian religious life: rituals, pilgrimages, St. relics. Catholicism and Orthodoxy. Main directions of Protestantism and influence on the formation of modern Western society. Christianity in Latvia. Christian cultural heritage as objects of sacred tourism.
7.	Islam: origin, basic principles and denominations. Pilgrimage tradition in Islam. Islamic sacred places.
8.	"Eastern" religions. The specific of worldviews and understanding of sacredness. Vedic religion. Brahmanism. Hinduism. Temple and rituals. The attractiveness of Hinduism culture and art in the religious tourism market.
9.	Buddhism: origin, basic principles and denominations. The Practice of Pilgrimage in Buddhism. Objects of sacred tourism in Buddhist countries.
10.	Religions in Latvia. Objects of sacred cultural heritage and opportunities for the development of sacred tourism in Latvia.
11.	Religions and religious traditions: cultural heritage and (or) tourism potential.
